


At the start of this NACRO year last July, we set out to continue advancing NACRO in the areas of people, process, and professional development as outlined below.

Webinar - Building capacity for external partnerships in the context of a regional public PUI: Lessons learned through NSF EPIIC funding

Thursday, July 24, 1-2 p.m. ET

There has never been a better time for regional public institutions such as The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) to become more integrated into their regional innovation ecosystem. Like many similarly situated predominantly undergraduate institutions, TCNJ has made substantial investments in facilities and talent over the past several years and is ready to leverage that investment. NSF EPIIC funding framed around developing internal and external culture change, increasing awareness of potential partners' needs, and use of methodologies to identify, map, and cultivate partnerships has positioned TCNJ to be the model as to how research-active PUIs can engage more meaningfully with partners.
